Blue Raider Basketball Notes

Lindsey Wilson Hopes to End Losing Streak at Pikeville

Lindsey Wilson travels to Pikeville College today looking to end a four-game losing streak in Pikeville. The Blue Raiders last win against Pikeville in Eastern Kentucky came during the 2005-06 season.

Lindsey Wilson Leads All-Time Series

The Blue Raiders hold a 31-18 all-time record against Pikeville (since LWC became a four-year institution). The Bears own the all-time at home 12-11. Lindsey Wilson is 6-4 against the Bears in the last 10 meetings, but Pikeville has won three out of the last four.

Perfect in 2010

Lindsey Wilson is a perfect 3-0 since the New Year with wins over Asbury College, Marygrove College and University of Rio Grande. This month, the Blue Raiders have already more than doubled their win total from December (1-5).

Four in a Row?

With a win today, the Blue Raiders would to win their fourth game in a row for the first time this season. Lindsey Wilson has won three straight twice this season.

Blue Raiders Cleaning the Glass

In its last three wins, Lindsey Wilson has out-rebounded its opponents by 24 rebounds per game. The Blue Raiders out-rebounded Asbury College 52-25, Marygrove College 57-37 and on Thursday, LWC bested Rio Grande 45-20 on the boards.

Long Range Woes

Despite their recent winning ways, the Blue Raiders have struggled from beyond the three-point arc. As a team, Lindsey Wilson has made just 11-of-48 threes for 22.9 percent from deep during its three-game winning streak.

Finding the First

Lindsey Wilson found its first road win of the season on Thursday with a 72-58 win at Rio Grande. The Blue Raiders were winless in their previous two road games at Davenport University and Freed Hardeman University.

Recipe for Success

Despite some struggles this season, Lindsey Wilson's success under coach Paul Peck's revolves around two numbers, 70 and 50. When the Blue Raiders score 70 points in Peck's seven-plus years, Lindsey Wilson is 130-12. Additionally, the Blue Raiders are 72-7 under Peck when they shoot 50 percent or better from the field. This season, LWC is 8-5 when scoring 70 points and 2-0 when shooting 50 percent.

Offensive Juggernaut

Pikeville enters today's game as one of the most explosive offenses in the NAIA. The Bears rank fifth in the nation averaging 92.3 points per game and second in the nation in scoring margin, beating their opponent by an average of 29.1 points per game. Pikeville is also efficient on the offensive end, connecting on 52.7 percent -- third best in the NAIA -- of its shots.

Sitting Out

Pikeville starting center Andre Thornton will not play today following his ejection from the Bears' 57-63 loss at Campbellsville. Thornton is averaging 8.9 points and 5.5 rebounds per game this season.

Head Coach Paul Peck



Coach Paul Peck enters his eighth season as the Lindsey Wilson College men's basketball coach in 2009-10. He has led the Blue Raiders to a 179-72 record since returning to the program he once coached as a junior college in the late 1970s.

Peck is 415-271 overall entering his 22nd season as a head coach. He is 301-204 against senior college competition during his head coaching career.

The Blue Raiders have reached the NAIA National Tournament five of the seven years under Peck, including a pair of Elite Eight appearances.

Peck has guided the Blue Raiders to a pair of Mid-South Conference Tournament titles and shared the program's only MSC regular season crown in 2004-05.

Peck is a three-time Mid-South Conference Coach of the Year. He shared the 2002-03 and 2003-04 awards and was the lone MSC Coach of the Year in 2004-05.

The Blue Raiders earned the program's first-ever NAIA No. 1 ranking during Peck's tenure in the 2003-04 season after starting the season 22-0. That season, the Blue Raiders won a program-record 33 games.

Prior to coming to Lindsey Wilson, Peck had stints at Cumberland University, Kentucky State University and Panola Junior College. He also served as assistant coach at NCAA institutions Middle Tennessee State University, University of Mississippi and Western Kentucky University.
